It's no wonder that the late actor Robert Mitchum once said: "Half the people in America are faking it." And, at times, this fake mentality rears its ugly head among believers. The key to righteousness is doing the will of the Lord (Matthew 7:24, the wise man hears and does; he builds on the rock). But some deny Him by their actions. Many who appear to be devout often undergo a drastic transformation when away from the Body. Such behavior is disheartening to believers . . . and to Jesus. In fact, He will someday deal with them in a way they will not expect (Matthew 7:21 - 23).


